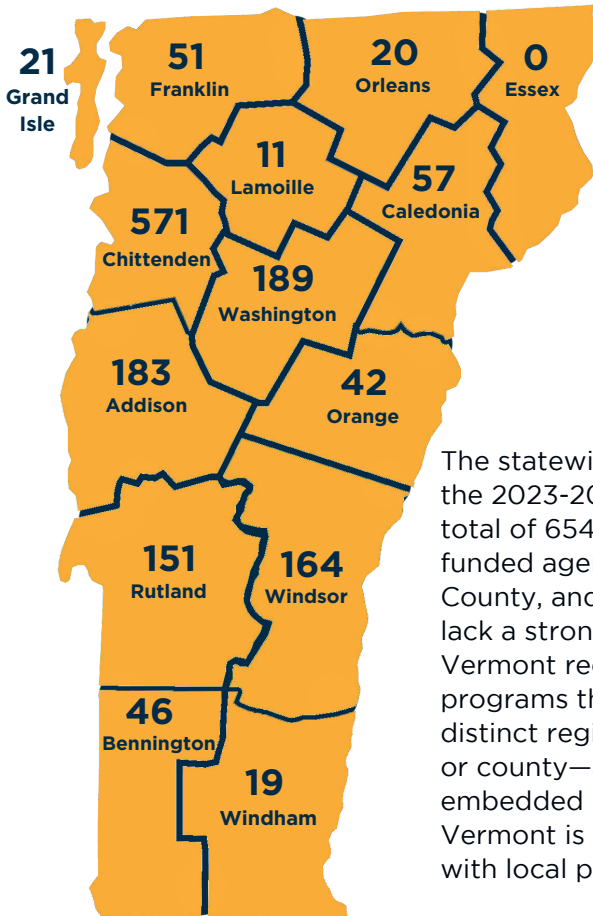

The mentoring field continues to foster new matches and recover from the persisting impacts of the pandemic.

Despite dedicated efforts from program staff, programs continue to find mentor recruitment more challenging than before the pandemic, with fewer Vermonters seeking to engage in volunteer activities.

The statewide match retention rate during the 2023-2024 grant year was 89%, with a total of 654 new mentor matches made by funded agencies. Essex County, Lamoille County, and Windham County currently lack a strong mentoring presence. MENTOR Vermont recognizes that mentoring programs thrive best when they have a distinct region—be it a town, school district, or county—and dedicated staff who are embedded in the community. MENTOR Vermont is actively seeking collaboration with local partners in these areas.

By identifying, promoting, and driving the implementation of evidence-based practices combined with community wisdom, we are increasing the quality of mentoring relationships for Vermont’s young people.

MENTOR Vermont requires funded programs to implement evidenced-based practices, guiding them through the National Quality Mentoring System (NQMS) and providing personalized consultation.

MENTOR Vermont’s trainings strengthen the quality of local mentoring relationships through research-based effective practices and enables program staff to focus more time on supporting matches.

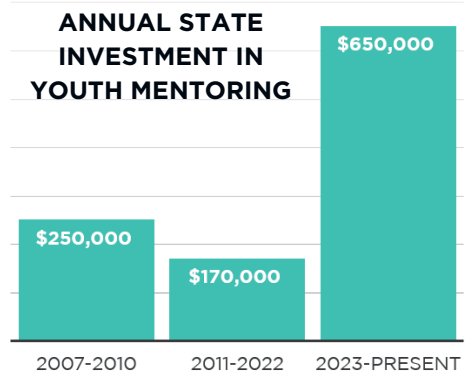

IN 2023-2024, YOU HELPED MENTOR VERMONT TO...

- Develop training modules for our soon to be launched learning management system.
- Provide technical assistance to 17 mentoring agencies, representing 500+ hours of no-cost, individualized program support.
- Launch the Youth Mental Health Pilot program and host 12 sessions for mentors and program staff.
- Conduct NQMS with 5 mentoring agencies to ensure best practices and identify areas of improvement.
- Host 11 live training sessions to support mentors and program staff.
- Host the 8th annual Vermont Mentoring Symposium with more than 70% of mentoring agencies in attendance.

INCREASING SUSTAINABLE INVESTMENT



MENTOR Vermont provides annual funding directly to youth mentoring agencies, investing in the creation and support of quality, long-term youth mentoring relationships. This grantmaking remains the only statewide mentoring-specific funding available in Vermont.

As a result of MENTOR Vermont's strategic advocacy work, the Vermont mentoring field secured the first increase in State funding since 2007, resulting in a 282% increase in State dollars invested in mentoring. Passthrough funding remains a central pillar of MENTOR Vermont's work, representing more than half of MENTOR Vermont's annual budget.



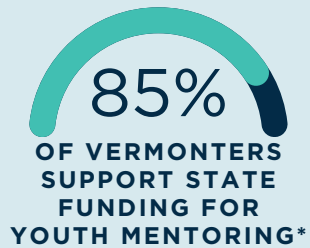

IN 2023-2024, YOU HELPED MENTOR VERMONT TO...

- Continue overseeing the Vermont Mentoring Grants, investing 58% (\$637,733) of the organization's budget to passthrough grants for youth mentoring agencies.
- Share funding opportunities with the field.
- Advocate for sustainable and increased State investment in youth mentoring.
- Support youth mentoring programs' fundraising strategies with resources, talking points, templates, and online platform hosting.

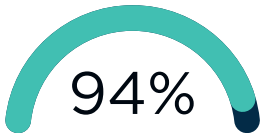


ENHANCING PUBLIC WILL

IN 2023-2024, YOU HELPED MENTOR VERMONT TO...

- Shine a spotlight on mentoring through 21 pieces of earned media coverage.
- Recognize the 2024 Ambassadors of Mentoring cohort of 7 youth-mentor matches and facilitate 15+ creative engagement opportunities for Ambassadors.
- Meet with the Vermont federal delegation in Washington, D.C. to discuss youth mentoring needs.
- Facilitate 19+ meetings between youth, mentors, program staff, and their elected officials to share mentoring experiences directly with legislators and elevate youth voice.
- Launch and maintain a new online, zip code-based search directory to ensure program visibility and support mentor recruitment.

MENTOR Vermont recognizes that everyone has the ability and opportunity to offer mentor-like support to the young people in their lives. Instilling a mentoring mindset helps inform and foster relationship-rich environments — helping teachers, coaches, crossing guards, neighbors, and others build a relationship centered community and surround youth with a web of support.

- Develop mentoring mindset training materials and resources for youth-serving professionals.

- Celebrate youth voice and inspire involvement by gathering and elevating mentoring stories.

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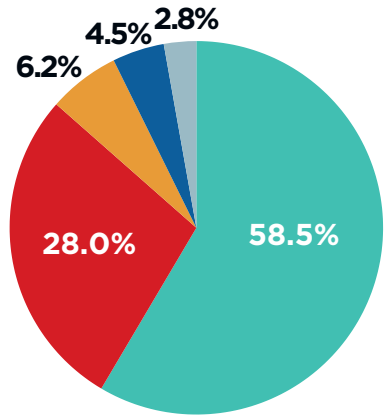
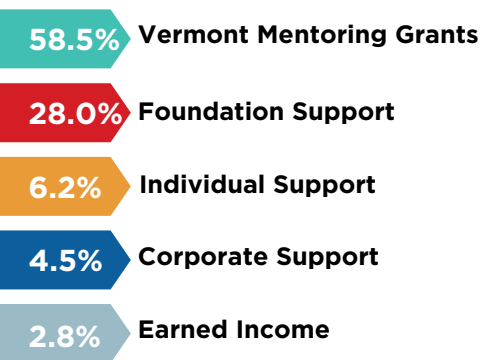

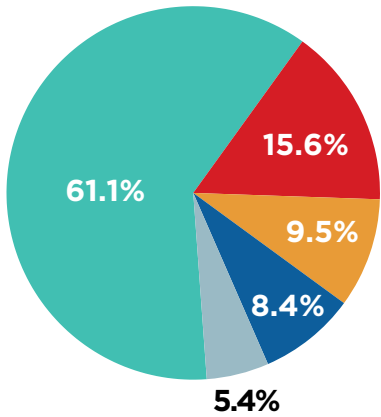
