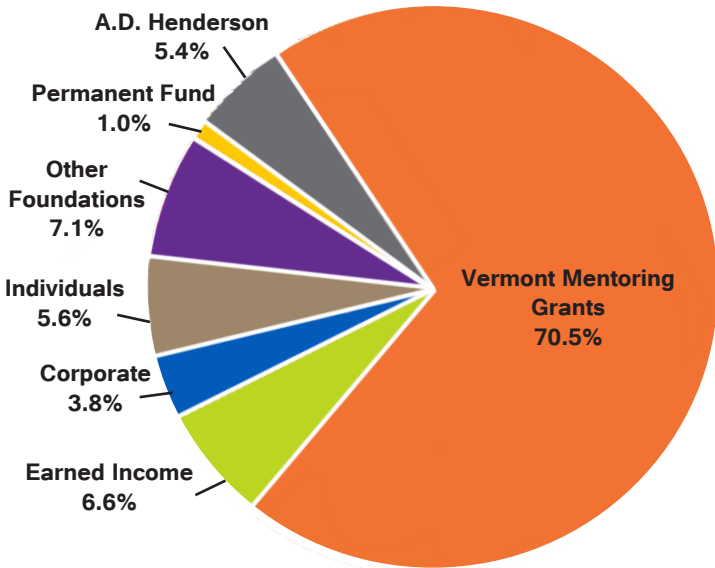

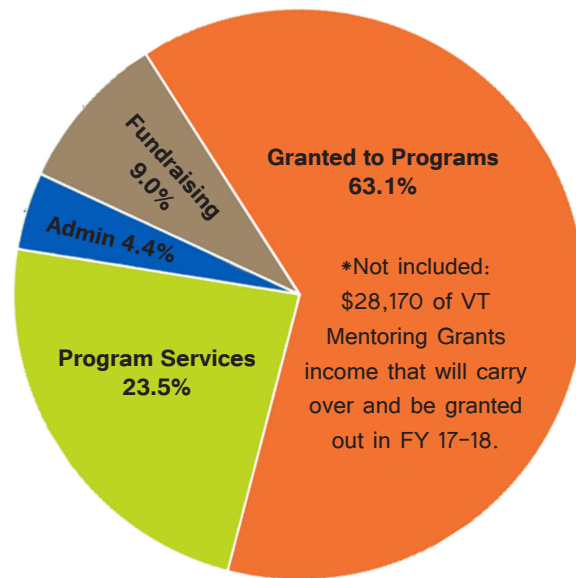
FISCAL YEAR 2016-2017 FINANCIALS

Income



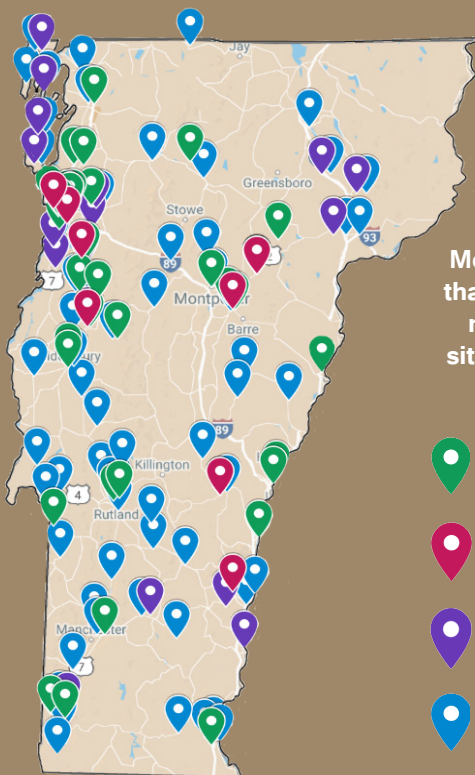
Total: \$545,506

K-12 MENTORING INITIATIVE

2016-2017 marked the second full year of the K-12 Mentoring Initiative. Mobius and its program partners continued to develop a statewide infrastructure for supporting youth from elementary school through high school graduation by developing partnerships to transition matches as the mentee ages out of the original program, and by launching three new programs with the capacity to support older youth.



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
