MENTOR Vermont's Centering Quality Initiative is one of four key focus areas driving the organization's work. This initiative is centered on identifying, promoting, and driving the implementation of evidence-based practices combined with community wisdom to increase the quality of mentoring relationships for Vermont's young people.

MENTOR Vermont aims to improve the quality and broaden the reach of youth mentoring in Vermont. Most mentoring programs are staffed by just one person, often in a part-time role. Program staff balance the hands-on management of matches, recruitment, and fundraising and do not have the capacity to review new mentoring research and design training curricula.

MENTOR Vermont's training strengthens the quality of local mentoring relationships through research-based effective practices and enables program staff to focus more time on supporting matches.

- Provide technical assistance to 10+ mentoring programs, representing 300+ hours of no-cost technical assistance.
- Collect statewide mentoring data and assess Vermont mentoring trends.
- Conduct NQMS with subgrantees to ensure best practices and identify areas of improvement.
- Host more than 15 live training sessions to support mentors and program staff.
- Host the 9th annual Vermont Mentoring Symposium.
