
- Hosting the Vermont Mentoring Symposium as a week-long, virtual event

- Providing funding to replace lost income


Our Ongoing Commitment to Diversity, Equity & Inclusion

In 2021, we established a **DEI Committee**, comprised of MENTOR Vermont staff and mentoring practitioners. In partnership with TC Consulting, we conducted a cultural assessment survey with MENTOR Vermont's stakeholders to determine how we can strengthen our organization's commitment to DEI, and **help support mentoring programs with incorporating DEI into their work supporting youth and mentors**.

With seed funding from MENTOR National, we are establishing a permanent, independent committee that will center the voices of youth, mentors, and families, and those from traditionally marginalized populations. We will provide annual funding to this committee to support the long-term work of bringing lasting change to the field.
